When possible, we indicate growth habit & disease resistance in the descriptions with the following:

(D) = Indicates a Determinate plant that will reach a certain size and produce a crop which ripens over a brief period.

(SD) = Indicates a Semi-Determinate plant that will reach a certain size and produce fruit over an extended period.

(CD) = Indicates a Compact

Determinate plant that will reach a certain size and produce fruit over an extended period. Actual plant size is smaller than other **Determinates**.

(I) = Indicates an Indeterminate plant that will grow and produce fruit over a prolonged period. **Hybrid** = Crossing two plants through pollination to breed a 3^{rd} unique plant. Like two parents and their child.

Heirloom = Usually coming from a farm, a family, or a geographical region by saving and growing many subsequent generations, for at least 50 years. **HEIRLOOMS** are varieties whose seed can be saved to produce the same tomato next growing season.

OP = Open Pollinated plants are pollinated by natural mechanisms like birds, bugs, wind, and people for example. All **HEIRLOOMS** are Open Pollinated, but not all Open Pollinated plants are **HEIRLOOM**.

RED & PINK-RED TOMATOES



AURORA- Siberian tomato named for the Aurora Borealis. Compact, bushy plants produce heavy crops of 4-6oz. red, round, and acidic but delicious, tomato flavors. Early producer that performs well in cool climates and high altitude. Works in the garden, green house, and containers. **(D) 59 days**

BEEFSTEAK- Considered the original *HEIRLOOM* beefsteak. Lush, thick plants with excellent productivity.

Yields many 4-5" slightly ribbed, bright red tomatoes that have spectacularly delicious, sweet flavors. Excellent taste, meaty flesh, and size (up to 2 lbs.) make it prized for sandwiches, but it is also great for cooking, salads, and canning. **(I) 80+ days**





BIG BEEF - (Beefsteak) What flavor! It has rugged vines which overcome adverse growing conditions. A rich old-time flavor, it features hybrid qualities such as impressive yields of extra-large 9-16 oz. smooth, red, globe-shaped fruit with superior disease resistance. **(I)** 73 days

BIG BRANDY- This terrific *HEIRLOOM HYBRID* is a result of crossing Brandywine with New Big Dwarf. The hybrid is much higher yielding and earlier to mature than its heirloom parents, with all of the great flavor and fewer blemishes. Regular-leaved plants bear pink beefsteaks that weigh 12 to 16 oz. and have all the wonderful taste of the original heirlooms. **(I)** 75 days





BLOODY BUTCHER - *HEIRLOOM* A very popular, early producing tomato variety. A good choice for an early tomato while you wait for later varieties to harvest. Vigorous plants yield copious amounts of 2" (4 oz.) fruits that are deep-red color inside and out. Five to nine fruits per cluster with a rich heirloom tomato flavor. A good variety for cooler growing regions since fruits ripen quickly. Great for canning. **(I)** 55 days OP

BUSH BEEFSTEAK - This is the perfect sandwich-sized fruit! Solid-fleshed fruits of a deep, rich red, average 8 oz. on vigorous, bushy plants are high yielders. **(D) 62 days.**





BUSH CHAMPION - One of the best varieties for small space gardens and containers, bar none. Compact plants grow to just 24" tall, producing extra-early yields of big, 8-12 oz. fruits with excellent flavor. Exceeds expectations with satisfying performance in virtually every climate. Good disease resistance. **(D) 65 days.**

BUSH EARLY GIRL - This "determinate sister" to popular Early Girl delivers the same desirable qualities in a compact, patio-sized variety. Extremely early with huge yields of firm, meaty, flavorful fruits that are larger than Early Girl - a full 4" is diameter. **(D)** 54 days.





BUSH GOLIATH - Developed for patio gardens, containers, and those with limited garden space. Compact plants produce huge, red, 3-4" fruits packed with flavorful meat and high sugar content. **(D) 68 days**

CARMELLO -HEIRLOOM This much

sought after and hard to find French tomato is among the best. Large crops of heavy, juicy, fruit with flavor that just does not stop. Consistently produces great tasting tomatoes even when the nights turn cool. Good for salads, sautéed, or as an integral part of any dish. **(I) 75 days OP**





CASPIAN PINK (Beefsteak) - This

HEIRLOOM originates from southern Russia between the Caspian and Black Seas. Thought by some to be the "Queen of the Pinks", this prolific plant produces 1-1½ lb. globe-shaped, pink-red tomatoes with fruit that rival Brandywine in flavor and popularity. One of the best tasting Russians, it is also perfect for cooler nights. **(I) 80 days**

CELEBRITY - This *AAS Award Winner* established a new standard for main-crop hybrids with multiple disease resistance. Medium-sized, globe fruits are crack resistant and come in at about 7oz. **(SD) 70 days**





CHAMPION II - Features even more disease resistance than the original. High yields of red meaty fruit with just the right sweetness. Makes a delicious sandwich tomato! **(I) 65 days**

CHARGER - Features strong resistance to the Tomato Yellow Leaf Curl Virus, as well as others. A high yielding salad variety. Brilliant red, 8-10 oz. fruits are very firm and smooth shouldered with excellent flavor - high sugar and low acid. In trials, it proved widely adaptable in all areas of the United States. Crack resistant. **(D)** 76 days





COSTOLUTO GENOVESE - An Italian, heat-loving, *HEIRLOOM* tomato that has been enjoyed for many generations along the Mediterranean. Meaty, full-flavored, slightly tart, and delicious. Because of its scalloped edges, it has also been known as the 'Ugly Tomato' but is perfect for use in an arrangement of different colored slices of tomatoes. Makes a rich and pungent pasta sauce. **(I) 78 days**

DAMSEL - Dainty, compact plants yield pink, round, beefsteaks with beautiful late blight resistance. 'Damsel' offers outstanding *HEIRLOOM* flavor with uniform fruits in the 12 oz. range. Disease resistant to late blight and verticillium wilt. **(I)** 75 days



DEBUT - Compact enough for patio containers or small gardens, big 8-10 oz. fruits, flavor that is unbeatable for fresh eating, enormous yields, great disease resistance –what more can you want? Dark red fruits with smooth shoulders and a small blossom-end scar. **(D)** 70 days





DELICIOUS - An excellent **Beefsteak** *HEIRLOOM* slicer, with most fruits over 1 pound, some 2-3 lbs. Above average yields of globe to ribbed-shaped beefsteaks that are smooth, solid, and seldom crack. **(I)** 77+ days

FIREWORKS – Exploding with a sweet, but wellbalanced flavor and one of the largest, super-early, slicing varieties we offer. Plants produce high yields of 8-12-oz., bright red, slightly flattened, 2-3" meaty fruits. Excellent for salads and sandwiches. (I) 60 days OP





FOURTH OF JULY-aka Independence Day - One of our earliest varieties, with the deep red tasty fruit ripening in early summer, hence the name. Big enough for slicing, they are extra juicy yet firm, and bear in clusters of 6 to 8. **(I) 49 days**



GENUWINE - Slicing type - A cross of Costoluto Genovese and Brandywine. 101/2 to 111/2 oz. fruits that have good flavor and few blemishes. Bred for improved yield, earlier maturity, and fewer blemishes while maintaining old-time flavor. **(I)** 70+

GODDESS- Early maturing, high quality 8 to 10 oz. juicy fruits that are flattened, globe shaped and firm. Resistance to late blight.
 (I) 60+ days





HEINZ - Excellent

for fresh market as well as ketchup, purees, and sauces, as its name suggests! Fruits resist cracking and plants feature good foliage cover. Smooth, round, 4 to 6 oz. globes. Good disease resistance and very meaty. **(D)** 75+ days **OP**

HOMESLICE - Looking for a compact, delicious slicer? This tomato only gets 18-24" tall and is perfect for containers. This early tomato produces 6-8 oz. red fruit.(D) 63 days





ISPOLIN (Beefsteak) This rare Siberian *HEIRLOOM* is one of the biggest Russians available. Plants can reach 8' if not pruned and produce lots of 1-2 lb. dark pink-red tomatoes up to 4" across with superb, earthy, tomatoey flavors. Good for cool climates and a delicious sandwich or salad tomato. **(I) 72 days**

JET STAR- Compact plants that will not take over the garden. Ripening tomatoes are less likely to crack than many others. With moderate disease resistance, Jet Star is a reliable mid-season producer that will keep going until frost. (J) 72 days





LITTLE SICILY -

Compact plants, with a tidy habit and healthy green foliage, are appealing in gardens and patios. At less than 24" tall, plants flourish in containers, stays a manageable size, and produces lots of tomatoes in a period of a few weeks. Fruits are delicious fresh or in your favorite recipes. 3-4 oz. red slicing tomatoes. (I) 60+ days

MOMOTARO aka Tough Boy - This is the most popular tomato in Japan. Plants produce abundant crops of round, red, medium sized 6-8 oz., and perfectly smooth fruit. Their taste is wonderful and intensely rich, with just the right amount of acid. **(I)** 74 days





PONDEROSA PINK -(Beefsteak) A returning personal favorite and a go-to big slicer. This beefsteak produces 1-2 lb. smooth tomatoes with few seeds and lots of meat with rich complex flavors. Late producer, but totally worth the wait. **(I) 86 days**

POSEIDON - In parts of Asia, pink tomatoes are considered the best because they are typically sweet with low acid levels. This variety offers very smooth, unblemished pink fruit that weighs about 8oz. each with a delicious, mild flavor. **(I) 78 days.**





RED BRANDYWINE - HEIRLOOM.

Pennsylvania Amish heirloom dating to 1885. Delicious, scarlet-red fruits weigh up to 2 lbs. Regular leaved plants. **(I) 90+ days**

RED PRIDE - The blue-ribbon winner! Yields a bountiful harvest on vigorous, compact plants. It has superb flavor and is adaptable to almost any climate. Reliable production of 10 oz. fruits combined with excellent disease resistance **(D)** 78 days





SASHA'S ALTAI- A superb Russian *HEIRLOOM*. Hearty plant which produces very good yields of 4-6 oz. thin-skinned, bright red, slightly flattened, round tomatoes with an awardwinning complex flavor. Fruit sets well in cooler climates and high altitudes. Seeds are extremely rare and hard to find. Good for containers and small gardens. **(I)** 57 days

SILVERY FIR TREE – A very early season, dwarf Russian *HEIRLOOM.* 2 ft. plants with fernlike, silvery fuzzy leaves that yield moderate crop of 4-5oz. flattened, round tomatoes. Perfect for small containers and hanging baskets. A unique tomato variety that is disease resistant. **(D) 54 days**





STELLAR – Beautiful

red, round, 5-7 oz., delicious, slicing tomatoes that are perfect for all uses. A high yielder, with excellent resistance to Late Blight. Also has intermediate resistance to Early Blight and Septoria Leaf Spot. Ideal for small-space gardens and large containers. High yielder. **(D)** 70+ days

STUPICE (say "stoo-PEECH-ka") - This Czechoslovakian *HEIRLOOM* is cold tolerant and very early, like Siberian. It bears an abundance of very sweet, flavorful 2-3" deep red fruit. Great container or small garden choice. **(D) 52 days**





SUPER SIOUX - An excellent variety for areas with hot summer temperatures, since it sets fruit well despite the heat and dry conditions. Thick-walled, crack-free, red globes have an acidic flavor. Perfect for canning. **(SD) 70 days**

SWEET CHARLOTTE - Perfect for a sandwich, in salads, or just sliced. Large determinate plants have enough vigor to offer high yield potential, and attractive 8-10 oz. fruit with wonderful flavor. Works well for market gardeners and home gardeners alike. **(D) 72 days**





THESSALONIKI – The pride of Greece this tomato is a top performer. Uniform baseball size tomatoes are blemish free and seem to outlast all others if left a little longer on the vine even after turning red. Flavor is mild, and its consistency and early production make it a favorite. **(I) 69 days**

ULTIMATE OPENER- Frequently, early tomatoes are under-sized and have marginal flavor. This red tomato, developed by the same breeder of Early Girl and Better Boy, produces fruits about 33% larger than Early Girl with marvelous flavor that is sweet and juicy. **(I)** 55 days

When we first started specializing in providing unique varieties to Southern Colorado gardeners, I thought, "Who would eat a brown or purple tomato? Then I tried one. Now, if I were only going to grow 4 plants, 2 of them would be from this group." ~Wayne (Owner)

BLACK BEAUTY – Truly a wild and magnificent variety, the darkest tomato we know of. Rich earthy flavors. Fruit size can vary a little bit. Beauty is high in the antioxidant anthocyanin (blueberries and blackberries) making it beautiful and nutritious. **(I) 80 days**





BLACK CRIMSON (Beefsteak) – This rare *HEIRLOOM* is originally from the former Soviet Union. It produces outstanding yields of 3-4", 10-12 oz., slightly flattened, mahogany (slightly maroon) fruit with deep green shoulders. Fantastic intense flavor. Suitable for containers and patio gardens. Perfect choice for slicing, salads, and cooking. **(I)** 75 days

BLACK FROM TULA (Beefsteak) – This Russian *HEIRLOOM* is one of the largest black varieties with 3-4" slightly flattened (good for slicing) fruit, which weighs up to ³/₄ lb. Dark mahogany with green shoulders, the fruit is round and smooth, not ribbed like many beefsteaks. Delicious smoky fruit flavors. This one is sure to please! **(I)** 75+ days





BLACK KRIM (Beefsteak) - This rare

HEIRLOOM is originally from the former Soviet Union. It produces outstanding yields of 3-4", 10-12 oz., slightly flattened, mahogany (slightly maroon) fruit with deep green shoulders. Fantastic intense flavor. Suitable for containers and patio gardens. Perfect choice for slicing, salads, and cooking. **(I)** 75 days

BLACKS**BLUES**PURPLES (CONT'D)



BLACK PRINCE - This *HEIRLOOM* is one of the most sought after and hard to find black tomatoes. Originally from Irkutsk, in the Siberian region of Russia. Deep garnet colored skin on round 2" (2-3oz.) Tomatoes are full of juice and have an incredibly rich fruity flavor. Perfect for small gardens, containers, and cool night areas. Eaten fresh, in sauces and other culinary delights. **(I)** 70+ days

BLACK SEA MAN - This 1930's **HEIRLOOM** was first brought to America from Ukraine. Plants produce roughly 1lb. perfectly round tomatoes, blemish-free, and deep burgundy. The tomato is rich, filled with depth, with flavorful hints of pineapple and tropical fruit. Low on seeds and gel, making this great for all purposes. Plants are good producers all season long. **(D) 75 days**





BLUE BEAUTY (Beefsteak) – Beautiful tomato that fully ripens from deep purple to red. Medium to large 6- 8oz. meaty tomatoes are good for slicing and have high yield. **(I) 80 days**

BRAD'S BLACK HEART - HEIRLOOM One of the only Black Heart varieties in existence. Extra dense, meaty flesh, classic richness of dark tomatoes. Wispy, droopy foliage. Yields copious amounts of 12 oz. pinkblack, heart shaped fruits. Rich sweet complex flavors. A good producer in cooler growing regions. **(I)** 75 days OP



BLACKS**BLUES**PURPLES (CONT'D)

CARBON- This *HEIRLOOM* is a beautiful deep

purple/brown on the outside with a deep brick-red interior. It won a taste test of heirlooms at the Cornell Research Farm. Yields prolific amounts of medium to large 8-14 oz. fruit with exceptionally rich, complex flavors. **(I)** 76 days





CHEROKEE CARBON - Robust, purple, 10-12 oz., beefsteak fruits are full of rich flavor. A cross of Cherokee Purple and Carbon. Bred for improved yield, earlier maturity, and fewer blemishes while maintaining old-time flavor. **(I)** 75+ days

INDIAN STRIPE - This *HEIRLOOM* variety bears 8 to 10 oz. burgundy-purple tomatoes that have an exquisite taste with the richness and complexity of fine wine. The fruit gets its name from the faint green stripes that fade as tomatoes ripen. This variety has been compared to Cherokee Purple, but Indian Stripe bears more heavily, and the fruit is a bit lighter in color. **(J) 80 days**





JAPANESE BLACK TRIFELE - Highly prized *HEIRLOOM* from Russia. Yields prolific quantities of 6 oz. fruit that resembles a beautiful mahoganycolored Bartlett pear with green shoulders. One of the blackest varieties available. **(J) 81 days**

BLACKS**BLUES**PURPLES (CONT'D)



NYAGOUS - Prolific rare Russian *HEIRLOOM*. Smooth, round, blemish-free on the outside, these 6-8 oz. fruits are firm with excellent texture, sweet complex flavors and have a clean acidic finish. (I) 75+ days

PAUL ROBESON (Beefsteak) - This famous Russian *HEIRLOOM* was named after the operatic artist who won acclaim as an advocate of equal rights. Originally from Siberia, it sets fruit at cooler temperatures and grows to 4" wide. Slightly flattened and round, its deep, rich color sets it apart from others. **(I)** 74 days





PURPLE BOY - Like heirlooms that are loved for their great taste and unique appearance, and this hybrid delivers on both! Fruits are 6-7 oz., have a sweet/acid balance flavor, nice texture, and beautiful color. Provides home gardeners and farm markets growers with strong disease resistant plants and good yields. **(SD) 70 days**

TASMANIAN CHOCOLATE - A unique dwarf tomato! Sturdy, 2–3 ft. plants, with dark green foliage, produce large 8-12 oz., beefsteak type fruits that ripen to a beautiful mahogany red. Great for small spaces and containers. **(D) 70 days**



TOMATOES OF A DIFFERENT COLOR BI-COLOR*GOLD*GREEN ORANGE*YELLOW

AZOYCHKA (Beefsteak) - This Russian HEIRLOOM is a

favorite! This delightful, small 8 oz. tomato matures so early that it will be one of the first to ripen in your garden. The lemon-yellow fruit is very flavorful, rich but sweet, with a delicious hint of citrus, and good acidic balance. Good choice for high altitudes and cooler nights. **(I)** 70 days





DAD'S SUNSET - 3 to 6 oz.,

deep yellow, sweet, juicy, and slightly fruity. Vines are around 6 feet tall and prolific. If you like yellow tomatoes that have high flavor but low acidity, here is one for you. Great slicer for sandwiches, sauces, salsa and as garnish. Please try them straight from the vine. **(I)** 95 days

DWARF ULURU OCHRE – First of its name, first of its color, conqueror of the sweet and master of tart. Plant produces an orange/black 12 oz. tomato. One of the most unusual tomato color variations we've seen. Always brilliant and unique. **(I) 65 days**





GREEN BERKELEY TIE DYE - Vivid shades of red, green, and amber come together in a kaleidoscope pattern on this amazing tomato. Red and green stripes color the outside while the interior is chartreuse marbled throughout with ruby red. Beautiful 8-12 oz. vigorous, productive plants well suited to most climates. **(J) 70 days**

BI-COLOR*GOLD*GREEN ORANGE*YELLOW (CONT'D)

GREEN ZEBRA - This *HEIRLOOM* produces 2" round fruit and ripens to a yellow-gold with dark green zebra-like stripes. The flesh is lime-emerald in color. A great green tomato for brightening up salads and other tomato dishes. **(I)** 75 days





JAUNE FLAMME -

Extremely prolific, gourmet French *HEIRLOOM* that bears in clusters of six. Beautiful 1½" round tomatoes are persimmon-orange inside and out. Delicious, fullbodied flavor. Good in salads, but also makes a great flavored sauce. **(I)** 70 days

ORANGE OXHEART - *HEIRLOOM* Big 10-12 oz., heart shaped, meaty fruit are sweet and juicy. Well balanced flavors and attractive color make this a perfect addition to salads, or as a delicious juicy slice on a sandwich. Vigorous indeterminate vines benefit from growing in cages. One of the best tasting among the Oxheart types. **(I)** 76 days





PINEAPPLE(Beefsteak)- This 2 lb. HEIRLOOM

bi-color, slightly flattened tomato has red blushing and streaks on its primarily yellow orange outside and this incredible red starburst on the inside with few seeds. The taste is rich with fruity, sweet flavors and lots of juice. (I) 85 days

BI-COLOR*GOLD*GREEN ORANGE*YELLOW (CONT'D)

PINEAPPLE PIG – *HEIRLOOM* Tomatoes are large and plump, weighing up to 1 or 2 pounds, with a somewhat rounded, bumpy shape. The fruits ripen to a creamy yellow color with light green stripes or specks and a pale pink blush. The flavor is mild and sweet with very low acidity and fruity undertones. Plants often reaching 5 to 7 ft. high **(I)** 75 days





PINK BERKELEY TIE-DYE -

Every bite of this psychedeliccolored beefsteak type tomato is an experience! This big and beefy tomato can reach 8-12 oz. with a rare blend of sweet, spicy, and acidic flavor. The green skin with yellow streaks leads to the bright interior

flesh of trails of red, green, and yellow. The relatively compact plants produce early for such a large tomato. (I) 65+ days OP

PORK CHOP – This tomato variety has large10 oz. fruits that are true lemon-yellow. A flat shouldered tomato that matures from yellow with green stripes to bright gold. We found it to be sweet in flavor with a hint of citrus. **(I) 80 days**





SOLAR FLARE
(Beefsteak)- Striking red
fruits are 6-10oz with gold stripes.
Luscious and meaty with a slightly sweet and full tomato
flavor. (I) 75 days

VIRGINIA SWEETS

(Beefsteak) – This *HEIRLOOM* variety is simply one of the best tasting, best producing gold-red bi-colors ever grown. Golden yellow tomatoes are colored with red stripes that turn into a ruby blush on top of the golden fruit. The flavor is sweet and rich. (I) 80 days



*CHERRIES * *GRAPES * *PEARS

Not all cherries are sweet..... some are sassy, please read descriptions



BLACK CHERRY - This variety is the only "truly" black cherry. Vigorous plants produce heavy yields with huge clusters. Fruits are 1" round, deep purple-mahogany and have an irresistible sweet, complex, full tomato flavor we've come to appreciate in black tomatoes. **(I) 64 days OP**

BLACK STRAWBERRY -

Fantastic, sugar-sweet tomato flavor, that is fruity, with a hint of grape and plum flavors. This 1-ounce fruit is marbled in blue, scarlet, and gold. A bowl full resembles a luminous and luxurious bunch of gems, and indeed the flavor is decadent and indulgent, with perfectly sweet and tart balanced flavor! (I) 60 days





BLACK VERNISSAGE – Large plump tomato, excellent producer from beginning to end of season. Fresh eating if picked early seems to be best. Otherwise, people love these roasted or in sauces like a lot of black tomatoes they are full of complex flavors. **(I)** 75 days

BLUSH - A large oval cherry type tomato with shiny yellow fruit striped, red, developing a warm orange blush when fully ripe. Very low acid, meaty, and super sweet. Large clusters and a heavy yield on a vigorous but contained plant. Blight resistant. **(I) 70 days**





CHERRY FALLS - Tidy habit and good early establishment makes this a good choice for adding to your mixed flowering containers or large baskets. Very vigorous, heavy 1½ to 2 oz. juicy, bright red fruits crop heavily over a long harvest period. Plants cascade 36 - 40" or can be vined or caged and reach 6' in height. This is one of the varieties you will find in our tomato hanging baskets. **(I) 60 days**

NEW CHIAPAS WILD -

Originating from the state of Chiapas in Southern Mexico. This is an ancient *HEIRLOOM* tomato variety. A sprawling, regular leaf plant produces red, pea-sized, currant-cherry tomatoes that are very sweet. Kids will love these delicious currant tomatoes! **(I)** 69 days





CHOCOLATE CHERRY- Extremely flavorful, uniform round fruits in trusses of 8, each measuring 1" in diameter. These mahogany brown, bite-size morsels can be picked several days before completely mature and allowed to ripen off the vine without sacrificing quality. (J) 70 days OP

CHOCOLATE SPRINKLES – With a name like a confection and striped dark-chocolate grape-shaped tomatoes, this one is too tempting to pass up. The fruit is delightfully sweet, perfect for snacking on or adding on top of salads. Tall, disease-resistant plants bear huge crops of these delectable, crack-resistant cherry tomatoes. **(I) 75 days**





COCOA - Get deliciously sweet cherry fruits right from your windowsill or countertop. Plants grow just 6 to 8" tall and wide and produce 1/2 to 1" fruits, stay tidy and benefit from being grown dry. Great grown in containers on patios. (D) 70+ days

FANTASTICO - 2014 *AAS Winner*. Coming in at only 18-24" tall this tomato delivers an insane amount of small grape tomatoes. Suited perfectly for small containers and baskets. **(D) 60 days**





GLITTER - small grape-type tomato that can be expected to offer high yields with its vigorous growth potential. At full maturity, this variety produces a bright orange fruit, slightly larger and noticeably sweeter fruit than that of the common cherry tomato – perfect for snacking or your favorite salad. **(I)** 70 days

LIZZANO - Excellent for patio containers and hanging baskets. Its vigorous semi-determinate plant has a low growing, trailing habit. The durable plants grow 16-20" tall and spread approximately 20" in diameter. Lizzano produces good yields of high quality, bright red, cherry fruit that measure 1" in diameter. The plants have intermediate resistance to late blight and continuous yield throughout the season. This is one of the varieties available in our hanging baskets. **(SD)** 60+ days





PATIO CHOICE YELLOW - The ideal tomato for container gardening or small spaces! This eye-catching variety will provide you with an abundance of sweet, 1/2-ounce cherry tomatoes for canning, roasting, and drying. Beautiful in a container! High yielding and performs well in heat and humidity. Excellent disease resistance. (D) 50+ days

PINK BUMBLE BEE - Pink fruits are striped with yellow and are crack resistant. The Bumble Bee series of cherry tomatoes is sure to create excitement with its extraordinary beauty and superb flavor. Great for fresh tomato, basil, mozzarella, and balsamic vinegar salads. Vigorous vines produce continuously over the growing season. **(I)** 70 days





PINK PING PONG - This *HEIRLOOM* wasn't named for its taste, but rather for its size. Long vines bear prolifically with amazing yields of sweet, pink fruit which is juicy and bursting with superb flavors. Great for salads or canning.... if they ever make it into the house. **(I)** 75 days

RED PEAR - *HEIRLOOM* Hardy, medium-sized plants yield plenty of small, red, pear-shaped fruits with very few seeds. Perfect for salads, sauces, or pickles. **(I)** 70 days



ROSALITA - Long clusters of small, oval fruit are deep rosy pink and abundantly produced on tall, vigorous plants. These tomatoes are as sweet as rosé wine, and a delightful new choice for anyone who likes grape tomatoes. **(I) 60 days**





SUN GOLD- These positively luscious, thin-skinned, juicy, bite-sized beauties overflow with an abundance of oh-so-sweet, fresh-from-the-vine flavor. The only reason they make it to your kitchen is because they produce abundant yields from cascading trusses, which are smothered in fruit and bear continuously over the summer. One of the earliest-producing cherries. **(I)** 57 days

SUNRISE BUMBLE BEE - A stunning cherry with vibrant red, deep yellow and orange stripes on the outside and pink marbling on the inside. Beautiful inside and out. Complex flavor that is deliciously sweet while slightly acidic. **(I)** 70 days





SUN SUGAR - Our bestselling cherry! Descended from Sun Gold, this golden-yellow cherry tomato is even sweeter, with superb texture and a tangy sweet, tropical flavor. Resists cracking. The taste of these tomatoes is so intoxicating they're often eaten by the gardener and rarely make it to the table. **(I) 62 days**

SUPERSWEET 100 - A home-gardener favorite as the skins are too thin for mechanized agriculture. It has more disease resistance than Sweet 100 while keeping the same fabulous taste. Small 1" round, bright red tomatoes are deliciously sweet. Long clusters of fruit, up to 100, on tall, vigorous plants and continue to bear until frost. **(I) 65 days**





SWEET MILLION – An early maturing tomato that is a vigorous grower that provides lots of fruit throughout the season. May need to be staked for support. Resistant to wilt and viruses. **(I) 60 days**

SWEET N' NEAT YELLOW - An ultra-compact, dwarf variety that is bred to thrive on windowsills, decks and in patio containers. Strongly branched plants produce masses of sweet fruits over a long season for continuous harvests. Petite, 1-inch rounded fruits weigh less than an ounce, with a memorable flavor that sparkles with sweetness. Vines will reach 12-14 inches if staked. This is one of the varieties we have available in hanging baskets. **(D) 60 days OP**





YELLOW PEAR - *HEIRLOOM* Huge, bushy plants yield huge quantities of 1 oz., 1¹/₂" long, bright yellow, pear-shaped, cherry tomatoes which will give you fruit until frost. Good producer even in cooler weather. **(I) 70 days**

*PLUM**ROMA**SAUCE**SALSAS

AUDREY'S LOVE - This dwarf variety only grows about 2-3 ft tall. The fruits are plum shaped paste type tomatoes. A deep red with green striping. Can be used in salads or fresh eating. Very juicy. The flavor is mild but intensifies if cooked like most paste tomatoes. Very productive for a dwarf variety. **(I) 78 days**



BLACK PLUM- This very prolific Russian *HEIRLOOM*



has great yields. A lovely brown-red mahogany with bright red flesh. Oval fruits come in at 2-4 oz. This variety has been sought after for its comparability in taste and uses to Roma. **(I) 80 days**

BRANDY SWEET - This variety that has Brandywine crossed with a cherry tomato is a winning combination with a delicious, sweet taste. Slightly elongated pink cherries appear in abundance on potato-leaved plants **(I)** 75 days





GRANDMA MARY'S – *HEIRLOOM* One of the best

paste tomatoes for short season growers. It produces copious amounts of 6-10 oz., 1-3½ inch bright red, meaty fruit very early in the season. This is a great variety for sauces, salsas, and cooking. **(I) 68 days**

GRUSHOVKA- Siberian *HEIRLOOM* variety of delicious, pink, 2-3" plum-shaped tomatoes on very compact plants. Plants are only about 2-1/2 feet tall but produce abundantly and are a very good choice for container gardening. These little tasty tomatoes are thin skinned and excellent for canning whole or diced. **(D) 65 days**

MARGHERITA - Named after Pizza Margherita, the classic summertime pie topped with mozzarella, tomato, and fresh basil. These elongated 5 to 6 oz. paste tomatoes are also great for many other dishes. Perfect for tossing into pasta or sandwiches. Vigorous plants yield large harvests. (D) 72 days

ORANGE BANANA - Sprawling plants produce good yields of 3", 2-3 oz. plum-shaped orange paste with a good sweet-tart flavor. Although a paste tomato, it is perfect for low acid salsas and sauces or just enjoying eating fresh. Holds up well to canning and drying. The orange color is unusual in a paste tomato. **(I)** 85 days





PLUM LEMON - HEIRLOOM Fruit is pointed on its ends just like a lemon with solid meat. 2 x 3-inch (6 oz.) fruit is a bright, clear-yellow tomato with mild sweet flavor. Perfect tomato for salads, tomato sauce or even a wonderful yellow ketchup. **(J) 81 days**

PORTER- A Southern favorite

well known for its drought resistance, producing high yields of small, 20z., plum-shaped, smooth, dark pink fruits under extreme conditions. Perfect for canning or salads. **(I)** 75 days



*PLUM**ROMA**SAUCE**SALSAS (CONT'D)

PRINCIPE BORGHESE - This is the variety Italians have long favored for drying. Meaty plum-shaped tomatoes have very little juice and few seeds, they measure just 1 1/2 in. long. The small plants become extremely loaded with fruit. **(D) 75 days.**





SAN MARZANO - *HEIRLOOM* from Italy. Compact and prolific producer of bright red, slim, 2", plum-type fruit over a long season. A paste tomato with pointy end, heavy walls, and little juice, so it's great for tomato sauce. Crack resistant. Better tasting than Roma. **(SD) 78 days**

SUPREMO ROMA - Produces a dependable midseason crop of impressively large, uniform tomatoes that set well even in heat. You'll have loads of tomatoes to make sauce or paste, chop for salads or salsas. Excellent disease resistance. **(D) 68 days**





YAQUI - From the breeder of Better Boy comes a huge set of bright red, blocky, meaty fruits on a tidy, compact plant. Extra-large plum-shaped fruits are unbeatable for canning, sauces, and pastes. Exceptional **disease resistance**. (D) 75 days
